THE GARDENS OF EASTON LODGE PRESERVATION TRUST TRUSTEE'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST JANUARY 2013

STATUS

The company, number 4638621, is limited by guarantee and has charitable status. The charity registration number is 1101442. It has a Memorandum and Articles of Association as its governing documents.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principle activity of the charitable company in the period under review was the continued preservation of the Gardens of Easton Lodge and keeping them accessible to the public.

ACHIEVEMENTS

This year we were open for 2 "Snowdrop Sundays" and a further 7 public open days from April to October attracting in excess of two thousand six hundred visitors over the course of the season. We obtained sponsorship for our 2013 Calendar which enabled us to generate greater funds for the Trust. We also received a donation of 50 tonnes of gravel which was laid in 4 hours by 16 volunteers in the Italian Garden. This has greatly enhanced the look of the gardens and reduced the work needed by the volunteers for maintenance. We continue to work with sponsors and are looking at ways of generating more support from local businesses. We had our first concerts in the garden on an open day which were particularly well received and have more scheduled for the coming season. We had positive discussions with the owners of part of the garden, Land Securities and secured their agreement to make the gardens more widely accessible to the community outside of "Public Open Days". Thus we have initiated a group visit scheme which we hope to see come to fruition in the 2013 season thus raising much needed revenue for the Trust. We met with the local schools consortium to forge links and encourage them to use the gardens and will work to expand this further.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

We have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our aims and objectives and in planning our future activities. In particular the Trustees consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives they have set.

REVIEW OF THE YEAR

In the Trust's 10th year of operation the Trustees:

- a. Continued to manage and run the gardens of Easton Lodge
- b. Received sponsorship of the 2013 calendar
- c. Received a donation of gravel which was laid in the Italian Garden
- d. Expanded children's activities in the gardens

FIXED ASSETS

No fixed assets were acquired during the year.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1a. Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), comply with the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005) issued in March 2005, applicable accounting standards and Companies Act 2006. The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

1b. Tangible fixed assets

Fixed assets are shown at historical cost.

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life by the straight line method. Plant and equipment 20%

1c. Taxation

The charitable company is exempt from taxation under s505 Income and Corporation Taxes Act 1988.

1d. Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

1e. Funds

The Restricted Funds are income funds given to the charity for infrastructure projects to support the charitable purposes of the Trust.

The Unrestricted Funds are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.
